
Do I need a Study Permit?



Permit is Optional	Permit is Required
Your studies are not part of a longer study program	All studies lasting more than six months
AND	
You complete your studies within the amount of time we've approved you to stay in Canada	









What?

- Photo
- Fingerprints
- Passport data

Who?

- Client between the ages of 14 and 79
- All Study Permit applicants
- USA citizens are exempt

Where?

- Choose the closest VAC or ASC
- Over 150 to choose from around the world

How much?

 85 CAD (in addition to the application fee)

When?

- Once in any 10 year period
- All Permanent Residence applications

Medical exam





What?

 An exam to protect the applicant and Canadian population

Who?

- Stays of 6 months or more in a designated country
- List is available online
- Internship with children or vulnerable persons

Where?

- Hundreds of panel physicians (PP) around the world
- Client chooses their physician from the PP list

How much?

 To be discussed with the PP

When?

- Possible before submitting the application but at your own risk (upfront exam) OR
- Within 30 days of the receipt of the letter from IRCC instructing you to go for a medical exam

Can I work as a student?



Without study permit



With a study permit and registration in a DLI for more than six months



- 20 hours/week outside of campus
- Full time during vacation outside of campus
- Unlimited on campus
- Co-op internships possible
- Not applicable to language studies, general interest courses, and preparatory courses





Family Member	Options / Types of application available
Principal applicant (the student)	Study Permit
Spouse / Common-law partner	 Open Study or Open Work Permit or Temporary Resident Visa or eTA
Children (who will enroll in 1st grade or above)	Study Permit
Children (who are not yet in school)	Temporary Resident Visa oreTA

Variable length





Find out if you are eligible to apply

Need help?

Do you want to work, study, visit, travel through or live permanently in Canada?

Answer a few questions to find out what immigration programs you can apply for. Each immigration program has different application and eligibility requirements. You will need about 10-15 minutes to complete the form.

You may be asked questions about your:

- nationality
- age
- · language ability
- · family members
- education
- work experience
- · income and/or net worth
- · details on any job offer

Based on your answers, we will tell you what programs you may be eligible for, so be as accurate as you can.

If you are eligible, we will give you a detailed list of instructions on what to do next.

Tips for faster processing!

Submit a complete application upfront

Respond to requests promptly

Do you medical exam!

Do your biometric enrollments!

Protect Yourself: Don't fall victim to fraud

- •If something seems too good to be true, it probably is!
- •Protect your money: IRCC will **never** call you and ask you to deposit money into a personal bank account nor to transfer money through a private money transfer company.
- •If you decide to use a representative, choose carefully. Not all **representatives are authorized** to represent you. Visit <u>Canada.ca/immigration-representative</u>.

•Giving **false information** in your application **is against the law**. You could be denied entry into Canada, be deported after you arrive and/or banned from applying in the future.



Travel restrictions in Canada



The Government of Canada has announced that as of January 15, 2022, nearly all foreign nationals will need to be vaccinated in order to enter Canada:
